Conformation become a matter of opinion.

Conformation became a matter of opinion, performance became a matter of fact!"

When you line breed your dogs, you don't want mixed results, when you breed you are trying to get "uniformity", you want the results to be consistent – but just as with any other purebred registered breed
within the conformation of the breed standard.

You also want to fix the breed traits that the dogs being line bred-on are renowned for.

For instance, the people who were linebreeding the Hollingsworth dogs were trying to get that rugged structural durability, and their unbelievable gameness, consistently and dependably, in their linebreeding efforts, because the flagship animals (The Hollingsworth Line) were known for these traits.

In linebreeding on Hollingsworth dogs, what the serious breeder should be paying attention to is a combination of performance, (breed conformation - appearance and ancestry).

If a Breeder is going to be successful in preserving certain traits they must rigorously select breeding specimens which display the desired traits and have similar pedigrees, in order to get consistency every time in their breeding's – then never ignore breed conformation or conformation and genetic conformation faults.

If you get a litter of "all red/red nosed dogs that look like the Hollingsworth line, color-wise, but no longer have the vigor or deep gameness to compete, do you really have "Hollingsworth dogs?"

In contrast, if all the dogs come out looking like the Hollingsworth line and performing like the Hollingsworth line, than you have made a successful linebreeding and have now harnessed genetic prepotency!
