16. Word meaning.

Registered owner means:

The person whose name appears on a [state or territory] register as the owner of the dog; in the case of an unregistered dog, includes the person last specified in the register as the owner of the dog.

Restricted breed dog means: any dog of a breed, kind, or description whose importation into Australia is prohibited by or under the Customs Act 1901 of the Commonwealth.

Selling a dog means.

Includes transfer ownership of the property in an animal by any means, including by gift.

Serious injury means.

Any physical injury that results in broken bones or lacerations that require multiple sutures or cosmetic surgery.

Veterinary practitioner means; a veterinarian registered to practice in [state or territory].

Working dog means used principally for.

1. Herding or tending livestock; or
2. Detecting illegal substances and goods; or
3. Searching, tracking, or rescuing; or
4. Working with police officer's military or security; or
5. Competition dog in various canine dog sports or working dog disciplines.

Dog at large means.

1. It is not under the effective control of a person / owner in a public place or in or on premises without the consent of the occupier.
2. It is a dangerous dog in a public place and is –
3. In the charge of a person under the age of 18 years; or
4. Without a muzzle; or
5. Not on a lead; or
6. Without an approved collar; or
7. Loose running dog in public – outside any owner's property or yard - – wherever the reason.
