WO men are in hospital and two others are nursing wounds after a pitbull linked to the death of Haidee Pook went on a bloody rampage through East London's Baysville suburb on Wednesday afternoon.

Pook, 45, was mauled to death on July 17 last year when she, Wade and another male friend arrived at Wade's Baysville home.

Haidee's father Ray Pook reacted: "How many times must this happen before someone else is killed?"

The family scattered Haidee's ashes from the river jetty in Hamburg two weeks ago.

driveway. "I shouted at her to go back

and tried to fend the dog off with my right hand, and managed to get behind the gate, but it got hold of my left arm and ripped my jersey off as the gate was closing. "It then mauled my jersey on the pavement. My hand had three deep puncture wounds and as I was wrapping it with my T-shirt I saw Travis running after the dog and catching it." Green's mother said a mo-
